Weekly Donation to St. Ann Parish

With the cancelation of the Sunday Masses, St. Ann Parish has lost its source of income, since our only income is from the weekly collection that occurs at Mass. We urgently need you, our faithful parishioners, to continue to support St. Ann Parish. I realize that this is a time of significant insecurity, financially and in other ways, for many people, but if you are able to continue your contribution to St. Ann Parish, it would allow us to pay salaries and keep the building heated. Currently there are four methods to make your weekly donation to St. Ann Parish:



- ✚ Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) is a great way to provide your regular offering to our Parish. To register for EFT, call the Parish Office and we will email you the necessary forms.
- ✚ Drop off your weekly envelope by putting it through the mail slot in the Parish Office door.
- ✚ Post-dated cheques. Instead of coming every week, put several post-dated cheques into the same envelope.
- ✚ We have registered for "Canada Helps", an online service to help charities receive donations. This would allow you to donate to the parish without registering for EFT and remain in the safety of your home. Log onto www.canadahelps.ca and search for St. Ann Parish, Ancaster. You can make a one-time donation or schedule a recurring donation. (*Canada Helps takes 3% of the donation as their service charge.*)

Thank you for your continued generosity and support of St. Ann Parish. Without you we cannot be the amazing parish that we are.
