

Jerusalem as He was welcomed by the crowds to shouts of Hosanna and palm branches laid at his feet. Only a few days later, as we know, everything would change as He hung upon the Cross with only a few people standing by his side. This Holy Week will look a lot different, but the meaning it has for our lives and for the world will be the same. Check the excerpt in the bulletin about what will look different this year.

I am very happy that Bishop-elect Lobsinger will be coming to help us celebrate these Holy days. His Excellency will preside and preach the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday and the 12 Noon Good Friday service. He will preside at the Easter Vigil and preside and preach at the 9:00 and 11:00 Easter Sunday Masses. Please note that incense will be used on Holy Thursday and at the Easter Vigil. We welcome him so he can celebrate the Triduum in person at Saint Ann and so that I can stay upright! Welcome back to Saint Ann, Your Excellency! During Holy Week we celebrate the great gift of the institution of the Priesthood. On Monday, priests of the Diocese will gather with Bishop Crosby at the Cathedral Basilica for the Chrism Mass and on Holy Thursday we celebrate the institution of the Eucharist and the Priesthood. This is my first Easter as a priest and while my first 7.5 months of priestly ministry have had their share of challenges and surprises. I remain profoundly grateful and joyful for this great gift God has given me. Please pray

HOW WILL HOLY WEEK LOOK DIFFERENT?

Following directives from the Congregation of the Divine



Worship and from Bishop Crosby, the following changes will be taking place during the Triduum this year to ensure that these celebrations are conducted reverently and safely.

HOLY THURSDAY

There will be no washing of the feet after the Gospel. There will be no Altar of Repose or procession with the Blessed Sacrament and the liturgy will end in silence. There will be no adoration after Mass.

GOOD FRIDAY

The major difference this year will be a communal veneration of the Cross, instead of an individual veneration, meaning that the Priest alone will venerate the Cross.

EASTER VIGIL

The assembly will remain in their pews for the blessing of the Easter fire and Paschal Candle outside. The Sacraments of Initiation will be held for two new Catholics that evening, following all of the Covid protocols.

EASTER SUNDAY

We will renew our baptismal promises but not have the Sprinkling Rite with the new Easter Water.

Please note:

Bishop Crosby has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese of Hamilton from the "Easter Duty" (to receive Holy Communion during the Easter Season, and, if aware of serious sin, to receive the Sacrament of Penance) for 2021 because of the pandemic situation.

TRIDUUM SEATING INSTRUCTIONS

The Diocese of Hamilton has required that we have reserved seating for all the liturgies during the Triduum. To meet the guidelines here at St. Ann's, you were asked to reserve your seats by signing up at the Masses on the weekend of March 6th & 7th to a capacity of 80 in the Church and on Eventbrite starting March 8th and closed on March 26th for the Parish Center. Thank you to everyone for your positive response. Due to our limited capacity **if you have not registered in advance, we will not be able to seat you in the Church.** This includes Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil, and all Masses on Easter Sunday.

The doors of the church will open 30 minutes before the liturgy. Those registered for the Church are asked to check in at the front main doors and those registered for the Parish Center at the back door off the parking lot. Please arrive no later than 10 minutes before the liturgy begins. You will be asked your name and a volunteer will take you to your assigned seat. Hand sanitizing and wearing a mask are mandatory. The assigned seating has been designated to allow for the maximum capacity within limits in both the church and the parish center. Thank you in advance for your cooperation to make our church safe for all those attending during this the most Sacred time in the Liturgical Year.
