## **DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE**

### **Standing up to corporate power in Honduras**

The People and Planet First campaign is about helping communities stand up to corporate power.

In Honduras, as in much of the Global South, corporations often threaten and criminalize activists who speak up against their abuses.

The Lenca Indigenous leader Víctor Vásquez was imprisoned for fighting the corporate takeover of his people's ancestral territory. Development and Peace's partner, the Honduran Centre for the Promotion of Community Development (CEHPRODEC), helped free him from jail.

Another partner, Caritas Choluteca, trains and accompanies community leaders in advocating for policies that respect human rights and the environment. Recently, they got mayoral election candidates to undertake to declare the municipality of Orocuina a mining-free zone if elected.

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Ann:

During the difficult and challenging time of the pandemic, our Welcoming and Safety Committee has worked hard to ensure the health and well-being of parishioners. I would like to offer my sincere gratitude for the efforts that were undertaken to implement and maintain the precautionary measures that kept our parishioners safe.

As of March 21st, we have moved into post COVID with several restrictions being lifted. Bishop Lobsinger is leading all staff and clergy in the diocese in a workshop called "Moving Forward Together" to prepare us for the new normal and rebuilding of our parish communities.

In the coming months we will need to essentially rebuild our ministries and reengage those who have not attended Masses in over two years. We need to recruit

volunteers and welcome people back to church. At St. Ann's we have already begun with having Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors and more than one Altar Server at most Masses. The training of new servers is underway. Starting this Sunday, the 9:00 choir will be back and after Easter the 11:00 choir will be in full voice.

We have learned a great deal during COVID and over the last two weeks we have seen a surge in people returning to Mass. It was wonderful to see you all in Church and also the abundance of little ones and visitors. Our Parish team has plans to begin Children's Liturgy after Easter and to consider Vacation Bible School this summer

As for the Welcoming and Safety Committee we will be making some changes. Starting after Easter it will not be necessary to have people sanitizing hands and ushering at communion at the weekday Masses. We will have hand sanitizer available at the doors of the church. Sunday Masses the Welcoming Committee will still be present at the doors of the church. We will continue to have the parish center open for Sunday Masses and make decisions based on the numbers if this will continue. The plan is to have families chose to sit in the parish center and then the children will go directly to their liturgy before Mass. We will not at this point have an offertory collection. We now have a collection box at the back door similar to the one at the front door (thank you to James) for your envelopes and offerings. The back door will now be open before Mass and be an entry point into the church and parish center. The Lady Chapel will not be open as a quiet room for children. It will remain as the confessional.

There are no longer capacity restrictions, and the wearing of masks is a personal choice, but not required. As we transition through these changes there are many that may have different levels of comfort and immunity, so let us continue to be sensitive to one another by showing patience, respect, care, and love. The Welcoming Committee will be wearing masks as well as Eucharistic Ministers. This is for their safety as well as the parishioners.

Those who wish to receive communion on the tongue are asked to wait until the end of the line when going to communion as per the recent directive from the Diocese. As we are preparing for the solemnity of Easter Triduum, which calls us to give witness to the good news of the Lord's victory over suffering and death, may the Lord bless you and yours abundantly this Holy Season!
