“Peace be with you.” Jesus’ words are so familiar that their depth of meaning is sometimes lost to us. They were so much more than a greeting!

Peace, foremost, is forgiveness. When we gather as a community at Mass, we greet one another with “Peace be with you” and we confess our sins, not only to God, but also to our brothers and sisters. We then ask God for mercy and forgiveness of our sins.

Forgiveness does not end in this life. I believe it will continue into the next life, into eternity. So, if we believe we will meet each other after this earthly life, we should begin forgiving one another now in this life. Someone asked me, “Father, will I recognize my loved ones in heaven?” Of course, you will. But you will recognize your loved ones not by their appearance, nor their expressions, nor their birthmark. You will

recognize them by their character: Their forgiveness, their love for you and others, and their way of life.

Forgiveness begins at home. For example: The husband forgives his wife and children; the wife forgives her husband and other members of the family, the in-laws. That grace and peace ripples outward, and that forgiveness extends throughout the community: Forgiveness of your neighbour, your pastor, and your fellow parishioners. Because we are made in the image of God, we have a divine capacity for forgiveness. We are like beasts when we kill, we are like men when we judge, and we are like God when we forgive.
