THE LORD'S PRAYER: "OUR FATHER"

- AND FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES

The next in our ongoing discussion series for the bulletin is a reflection upon the line "and forgive us our trespasses." Trespassing is a legal reference for crossing a boundary. Hence, we ask for God's forgiveness from sin when we have crossed a spiritual boundary He has set for us. The Ten Commandments are our boundaries. We have all made mistakes in our lives and that is the very essence of being human. We are not perfect like God. We have said or done things that we regret. Often, we know where the boundary is and we chose to cross it anyway. But God understands us and like the story of the Prodigal Son, he cherishes when we ask for forgiveness. The important issue here is to recognize our failures and concentrate on doing better. We grow from each experience and learn how to improve as individuals. We know God forgives us and we realize

the importance of regular confession. We NEED to forgive and be forgiven. We can live in spiritual denial or we can take a moral inventory and ask for forgiveness for our wrongdoings from God and others. In wholeheartedly praying this line for forgiveness and freedom from our shortcomings, we open ourselves to all kinds of new possibilities. Go forward, make amends, pray for forgiveness and be free of anger and hate ... life is too short. Regrets are too painful to endure.

Saint Augustine said: When we say: Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us, we are reminding ourselves of what we must ask and what we must do in order to be worthy in turn to receive. "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting." David, Psalm 139:23, 24
