MEMORANDUM FROM OFFICE OF JUSTICE AND PEACE

The escalation of the conflict in the Holy Land has left many appalled and looking for ways to help. Of particular urgency is the staggering loss of life and the lack of access to basic necessities, including humanitarian aid. As we continue to navigate the challenges this situation presents, here are some options to consider in coordinating support for those impacted. Advocate - Apply public pressure by contacting your political representatives and requesting a united call for an immediate ceasefire and urgent access to humanitarian aid in Gaza and the West Bank.

Humanitarian Aid: The conflict has prevented humanitarian aid from reaching Gaza and the West Bank. In addition, many agencies have sustained losses to their staff and offices. This will mean that the supply and mechanisms of support will be very limited. The
