

Dear Parishioners and friends of St. Ann: For us, November begins with All Saints Day (November 1<sup>st</sup>) and All Souls Day (November 2<sup>nd</sup>) as the Month of the Holy Souls. The month of November gives us a beautiful opportunity to reflect on our relation to the Communion of Saints: which is the link with the faithful who have already reached heaven, the faithful departed who are still being purified from their sins in purgatory and of the pilgrim faithful here on earth.

Often we say to one another, "Please pray for me," or "I will remember you in my prayers." But what about those who have died? Do we ask the saints in heaven to pray for us? And do we pray for our departed loved ones who may be in the state of purification known as Purgatory? A friend told me that his mother always encouraged him to offer up any suffering for those who have died and especially for the souls in purgatory.

If you are like me, you probably have certain departed loved ones whom you think about often. For me, not a day goes by that I don't think about my mom and my sister – and in remembering them, a lot of others come to mind: Grandparents, relatives and friends. We were not always "one big happy family" here on earth. There were some conflicts, bad words, even alienation. To be eternally together in heaven will require a healing and forgiveness that did not happen in any complete way here on earth. There will be pain in that process. The prayers, sacrifices, Mass which we offer for our departed loved ones can ease some of that pain. It is a great act of love to remember those who have died. "It is therefore, a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins" (2 Macc. 12: 46).

The Church offers us many other prayers and devotions we can offer up for our loved ones who have died: Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

This prayer can be added to the end of the "Prayer Before Meals":

Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts, Which we are about to receive, from Thy bounty, through Christ, our Lord, Amen. And may the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Here is a prayer you can say for your loved one:

Almighty God and Father, it is our certain faith that your Son, who died on the cross, was raised from the dead, the first fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Grant that through this mystery, your servant [insert name], who has gone to his/her rest in Christ, may share in the joy of his resurrection. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
