Dear friends and parishioners of St. Ann's: The season of Advent consists of four Sundays before Christmas and concludes with the vigil Mass of Christmas. Advent is a season of waiting as we anticipate Christmas.

The village of Ancaster is already lit up with lights and decorations. The shopping malls are filled with Christmas gifts and carols. People hurry about to find gifts, put up decorations or plan parties. Others are preparing to travel, sometimes through difficult weather and across great distances at one of the busiest times of the year. Amid such activity, it is easy to lose sight of the true significance of the season.

Advent has a two-fold character. During these four weeks before Christmas, we look forward to the celebration of our Savior's birth over 2,000 years ago. As we commemorate the First Coming of the Son of God we are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming, his return in glory at the end of time.

In the midst of frenzied shopping and end-of-year weariness, let us learn to recognize him among us and welcome him with joy. Come Lord Jesus!
