Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Lent is upon us – a time to strengthen our relationship with Jesus Christ and seek inner transformation through fasting, prayer, and acts of generosity. The Church assists us by providing many supports. Throughout Lent we are invited to participate in community celebration of the Holy Eucharist – on Sundays and at daily Mass during the week. Reading and reflecting on the Scripture passages of the day is an excellent practice, as is any reading that guides you closer to the Lord.

Throughout Lent, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered in your Parishes. If you are unable to find a convenient time, contact your Parish Priest who will be happy to find a time suited to your schedule. Most Parishes pray the Stations of the Cross as a faith community. Or you can pray them privately at your Parish church. The Holy Rosary is always a prayer that promotes inner peace and closeness to the Lord.

The Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace / Caritas Canada provides a variety of ways to offer "alms" to brothers and sisters in need through the Share Lent campaign. Create Hope is the central theme of this campaign for the coming five years. The specific theme this year is Reaping our Rights, echoing Pope Francis' recent reflections in Laudate Deum, "Everything is connected" and "no one is saved alone"! We are invited to uphold the rights of peasants, human rights, and environmental rights, ensuring respect for all.



ASH WEDNESDAY - 14 FEBRUARY

On this day, ashes are placed on the foreheads of the faithful to remind them of death, sorrow, and the necessity of changing their lives. "Repent and believe

in the Gospel." In our Catholic tradition, Ash Wednesday is observed by fasting, abstinence (from meat), and repentance—a day for contemplating one's transgressions.
