As we come to the mid-point in our Lenten journey through the lens of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit we see that each gift is vital. This week, we reflect on the gift of Courage/Fortitude.

Courage/Fortitude is the moral courage to do what we know is right. The word *courage* is derived from the Latin word *cor*, "heart". It is the gift that enables us to face danger and overcome fear with confidence. During the season of Lent, we often meditate on Christ's life and, in particular, His courage during His Passion and death.

Jesus called on His disciples (and so, on us) to follow Him and be courageous. This can be very difficult, especially in today's world where religion is routinely mocked and, in some instances, where Christians are persecuted and killed for their faith.

But we know that to follow Jesus is to be courageous, because He told us "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

In the Gospels. Before performing a cure Jesus often says, "Take courage...Take heart...Be confident..." Courage, like the other six gifts helps us as we navigate the high and low points of life. It helps us as we strive to be more like Christ, and it helps us strengthen our relationship with Him. That is why we must practice all of the gifts daily, and it's why we must allow our children to see that we are using them to live and walk with Christ. This takes daily determination, steadfastness, love, and devotion. The Gift of Courage enable us to see where our real strength lies: God is our strength.

Challenge for the week: Bring your personal challenges/difficulties before God in prayer – asking for the courage to confront them.

Let us pray +

God of Courage, your strength enables us to overcome any difficulty. May your Holy Spirit of Courage give us bold hearts to proclaim your love always. Amen.
