Continuing with our look at Lent through the lens of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, we turn today to the great gift of “Knowledge”. It is important to know things. We know how to make a living, how to raise a family, how to use a computer, how to make dinner.

But neither the joys of heaven nor a life here on earth really worth living is achieved simply.

We can, all of us, know everything there is to know ABOUT Jesus by reading, researching and studying – but that is all just head knowledge ... the challenge for us is to not simply know ABOUT Jesus – but to KNOW Jesus. And that, my friends, means moving from our heads to our hearts.

The Gift of Knowledge helps us to know the right things – helps us to know which things are important and which are not.

Even non-Christians can know a lot about Jesus. The Gift of Knowledge helps us to KNOW Jesus. “... No one can say, ‘Jesus is Love’ except by the Holy Spirit” (1 Corinthians 12:3).

A good way to tell if we are really using the Gift of Knowledge is to examine whether or not the things we know lead us to charity in our actions.

Putting our faith into action moves knowledge from the head to the heart!

Challenge for the week:

Make a concrete act of charity each day, then reflect and pray about what are the most important things in life.
