

SAINT CARLO ACUTIS: A MILLENNIAL PILGRIM OF HOPE

As we continue our exploration of models for being Pilgrims of Hope, we turn today to reflect upon one of our newest Saints – Carlo Acutis, the first Millennial saint.

My friends, in every age, God raises up witnesses to remind us that holiness is not a distant dream but a living reality. In our own time, in this digital, fast-paced, and often restless world, the Lord has given us the witness of Carlo Acutis — a fifteen-year-old boy in sneakers, a teenager who loved soccer, video games, and his friends, yet who also loved Jesus Christ above all things.

Carlo is a reminder that hope is possible — not the shallow hope that everything will go our way, but the deep, unshakable hope that comes from knowing Christ and living in His presence. He is what Pope Francis has called him: a "millennial witness of the Gospel," a pilgrim of hope for our age.

Anchored in the Eucharist

At the heart of Carlo's life was the Eucharist. He used to say, "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven." For him, daily Mass and adoration were not extra devotions, but the very center of his existence. Imagine a boy of his age — when many teenagers are running from one distraction to another — kneeling before the Blessed Sacrament, spending time with his greatest Friend.

It was from the Eucharist that Carlo's hope flowed. In the host, he found strength to face difficulties, courage to resist temptation, and joy that overflowed into his relationships. When he was diagnosed with leukemia, he accepted his illness with peace, saying, "I offer all my suffering for the Pope and the Church." What greater testimony of hope than a young man facing death, yet smiling toward heaven?

A Pilgrim in the Digital World

Carlo was a child of the internet age. He knew the fascination and the dangers of the digital world. But rather than being swallowed by it, he chose to use it as a tool for mission. He built a website cataloguing Eucharistic miracles so that others could see the wonders of God's presence across the world. He understood that the digital space could be a mission field — and he entered it with creativity and faith.

Isn't that hopeful for us today? So many people worry about the internet as a place of division, distraction,

and darkness. Carlo shows us it can also be a place of light, a space where the Gospel can shine. He invites us not to abandon the world we live in, but to transform it.

Ordinary Holiness

But, let us not imagine that Carlo was only about computers and church. He was, above all, a teenager who loved life. He played soccer, laughed with his friends, and enjoyed his games. Yet, he never allowed these things to dominate him. He lived with balance, with freedom, with joy.

Those who knew him remember his kindness — how he defended classmates who were bullied, how he shared meals with the homeless, how he gave his own money to help those in need. His holiness was not in grand gestures but in the ordinary moments of love. Isn't that the path open to all of us? To be faithful in the small things, to love in the little ways?

A Pilgrim of Hope

The word "pilgrim" reminds us that life is a journey. Carlo lived as a pilgrim, always walking toward heaven. He once said, "Everyone is born as an original, but many die as photocopies." Those words cut to the heart. He invites us to live our originality, the unique vocation God has given each one of us.

His hope was not vague optimism but, a confidence that God's love is real, that heaven is waiting, and that life — however long or short — is meaningful when lived with Christ. Carlo's journey was only fifteen years long, but it was enough to make him a beacon of hope for generations to come.

A Word for Us Today

My friends, what does Carlo's witness say to us? It says that holiness is possible here and now. It says that hope is not naïve but, deeply real when it is rooted in Jesus. It says that young people — our children, our students, our fellow parishioners — are not only the future of the Church but already its radiant present.

Carlo invites us to anchor our lives in the Eucharist, to use our gifts — even our technology — for the glory of God, and to live each day with kindness and joy. He calls us to lift our eyes beyond the fleeting to the eternal, to live not as photocopies, but as originals created in the image of God.

So let us walk with him as fellow pilgrims of hope. Let us, like Carlo, make Christ the center of our days. And, let us believe that even in our ordinary lives, the light of holiness can shine, pointing others toward heaven. Saint Carlo Acutis, millennial pilgrim of hope, pray for us.
