

OCTOBER, MONTH OF THE ROSARY: WITH MARY, WE JOURNEY TO THE JUBILEE "PILGRIMS OF HOPE"

We enter the month of October, the month of the Rosary, as the Jubilee Year 2025 draws to a close. Since the opening of the Jubilee, we have been invited to walk as pilgrims of hope, reviving our faith, rediscovering the sacraments, and placing prayer at the center of our lives.

This Marian month is part of this dynamic: it is a favourable time to remember the journey we have made during the Jubilee, to strengthen our hope, and to entrust the rest of our journey to Mary. The Rosary prayer, so simple in appearance, becomes a powerful spiritual tool to accompany us on the last stage of this Jubilee pilgrimage.

Mary, pilgrim of hope

From the very first chapters of the Gospel, Mary reveals herself as a pilgrim. After the Annunciation, she sets out eagerly to visit her cousin Elizabeth (Lk 1:39). This gesture is not only a fraternal service: it is a pilgrimage of charity, faith, and joy.

Mary carries Christ within her, and she goes out to meet others without delay. This mystery of the Visitation, which we meditate on in the Rosary, inspires us in turn to carry Jesus within us and, to pass Him on in our encounters with others, which is the attitude of the pilgrim of hope.

At the end of this Jubilee Year, Mary teaches us how to walk with confidence, with generosity, and, without fear. She is the model of the Church on the journey, and she accompanies us on our own inner pilgrimage.

The Rosary: a companion on the journey

Praying the Rosary means moving forward, mystery after mystery, through the life of Christ, with Mary as our guide. The joyful, luminous, sorrowful, and glorious mysteries are stages in our own life of faith. They help us to review what we have experienced throughout the Jubilee:

- > Joyful mysteries: beginnings, calls, graces received.
- Luminous mysteries: moments of conversion, sacraments, commitment.
- > Sorrowful mysteries: trials endured or borne.
- ➤ Glorious mysteries: hope that does not disappoint, resurrected life, the living Church.

Practical tips for living the Rosary at the end of the Jubilee

- Choose a fixed time of day to pray a decade or a rosary.
- ➤ Offer each mystery for an intention related to the Jubilee: peace, the faith of young people, fidelity in vocations, the sick, families...
- ➤ Read a short passage from the Gospel before each mystery to nourish your prayer.
- > Pray together, as a family or in a parish group: prayer becomes even stronger.
- Start simply: even a well-prayed decade transforms the heart.

Conclusion

As we approach the end of this Jubilee Year, the Rosary becomes a path of fidelity. It helps us to remain pilgrims at heart, even when the external celebrations come to an end.

Our Lady of the Rosary, make us pilgrims who pray, love, and hope, even after the Jubilee.
